Subject: Karen Chen on receiving delayed Olympic medal in new role

Good morning [REDACTED],

I hope this email finds you well. My name is Raven Sanchez, and I am on the communication team for U.S. Figure Skating.

I read your recent profile on Jayda McNabb and have been following your ongoing coverage of the U.S. Figure Skating Olympic team's delayed 2022 medals ceremony. I am reaching out to see if you would be interested in a story that adds onto the medals ceremony coverage; it will introduce the perspective of someone who was impacted by the delay but who is now on a different life path to the conversation.

It's been two years since figure skater Karen Chen competed in the Olympics. She has since moved to New York to study pre-med at Cornell University, and she is set to receive the [team event gold medal](#) from the 2022 Olympics alongside the other members of Team U.S.A. The medals ceremony was delayed in response to a Russian Olympic team skater's anti-doping rule violation and trial, but the trial resulted in a ban and an end to the delay.

Local Olympics followers would benefit from hearing Chen speak on this situation from her newly adopted outside role; she was directly affected by it and a Colorado Springs resident for four years. Her perspective lends a sense of closeness, realness and clarity to the situation that only a profile can capture.
